APPLICABILITY: Private Passenger and Commercial Motor Vehicle

SUMMARY: DMV Requests Company NAIC Numbers Appear on Insurance Identification Cards; New Reporting Required for Policy Terminations and Cancellations

- The Maine Bureau of Motor Vehicles has requested that the NAIC number appear on insurance identification cards, effective immediately.
  - ◆ However, effective July 1, 2003, this requirement will become mandatory and all ID cards issued to insureds will be required to include an insurer's NAIC number.
- The NAIC numbers for AIG companies licensed to write private passenger and commercial motor vehicle insurance in the state of Maine, are as follows:

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- Additionally, pursuant to Senate Paper 425, effective July 1, 2003, a new Maine Law, 29-A MRSA Section 1601-A, Notification of Cancellation of Insurance, will take effect and require an insurance company insuring a motor vehicle registered in Maine to notify the Secretary of State, Bureau of Motor Vehicles by electronic means when that insurance coverage is cancelled, terminated, or lapses. The Bureau of Motor Vehicles has been meeting with representatives of the insurance industry to develop a plan to implement these statutory requirements. A consensus has been reached concerning the data required to be transmitted to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. Accordingly, the Bureau of Motor Vehicles has provided a document listing the data fields that will be used in this process and advised that the transfer file structure is FTP. The Bureau will provide more detailed information regarding this file transfer structure as it becomes available.

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
