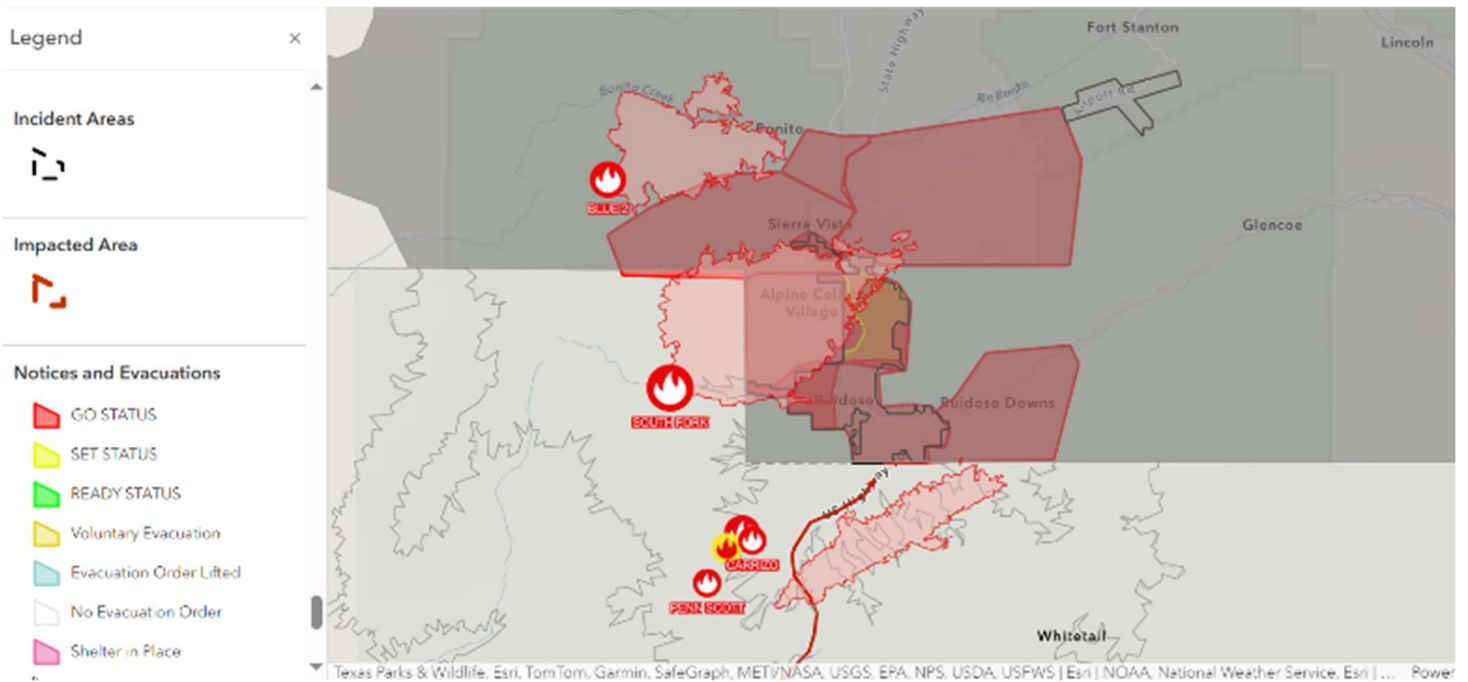

Central New Mexico Wildfires

2. **Event Details:**
  1. The South Fork Fire was discovered at 9 a.m., Monday, June 17, 2024; it is burning on Mescalero Tribal land, US Forest Service land and within the areas surrounding Ruidoso.

2. Early Tuesday the fire was estimated at 13,921 acres and zero percent containment. Fire activity is expected throughout the night due to winds and low relative humidity. Multiple structures are under threat, and an unknown number of structures have been lost.
  3. Fire growth has been rapid with extreme fire behavior. Long range spotting and intense heat with plume domination. The cause of the fire is under investigation.
  4. A second blaze, the Salt Fire, is also burning on tribal land south of Ruidoso and had scorched 4,876 acres by Tuesday with zero percent containment
  5. New Mexico Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham on Tuesday declared a state of emergency in Lincoln County and the Mescalero Apache Reservation due to the wildfires
