Tropical Storm Edouard

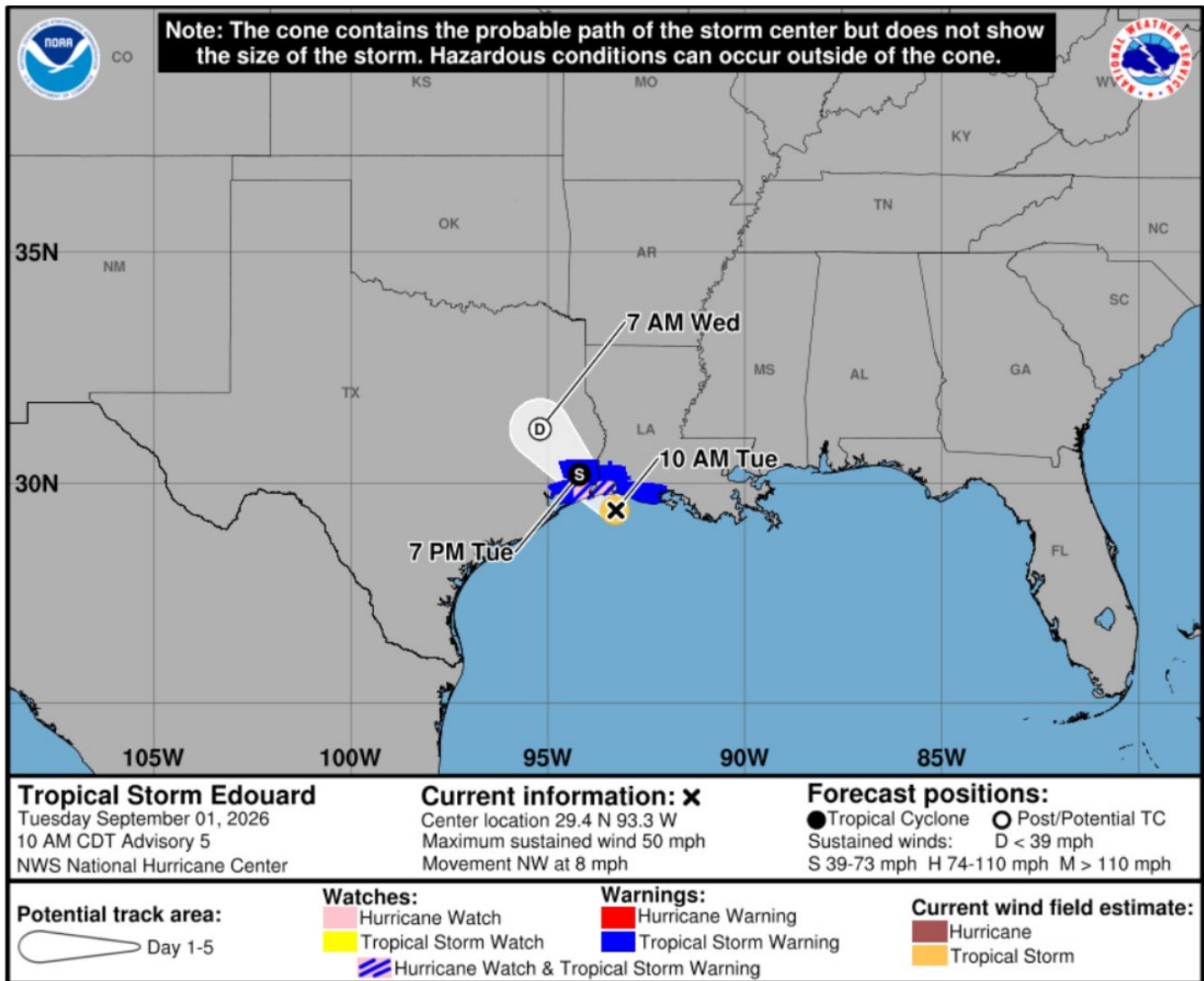
2. Event Details:

- Edouard currently has maximum sustained winds of 50mph and is nearing landfall. Tropical Storm conditions are beginning along the southwestern Louisiana and Upper Texas coasts.
- While the storm is not expected to reach hurricane intensity, continued intensification is expected prior to landfall. Hurricane conditions, especially in gusts, are still possible from High Island to Cameron later today.
- A Storm Surge Warning is in effect along the coast from High Island, Texas, to the Vermilion/Cameron Parish Line, Louisiana, where peak values of 3 to 5 feet above ground level are possible
- Heavy rain will likely impact parts of the Upper Texas coast through east-central Texas into far Southwest Louisiana today and Wednesday as Edouard tracks inland. A flood watch is active for southeast Texas, including Houston, through Wed. morning.

3. Moratorium Duration:

- Unless otherwise informed, this moratorium will automatically be lifted after 30 days.
