- 3) Once you select an item, you will be asked for a teamkey or serial number. Enter the teamkey given to you by your instructor and click on "Register ID."
- 4) You will be presented with a registration page. Fill in the required fields.
- 5) Once you submit your registration information, you will go to your Student Center page. Click on "My Courses" in the left navigation bar or "here" at the bottom of the page to access your Defensive Driving Course.
- 6) Enjoy the course and drive defensively!

It is also important to note that the course has been designed with a bookmark feature that allows participants to complete the course in several sittings. When returning to the site to continue training, participants just click on the "Returning Student" button and enter their username and password.
