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### 1100 - Apartment, Low Rise (1 to 4 Stories)

**Description:** Low rise apartments typically have one common exterior entrance, with individual apartment entrances located along interior hallways. This occupancy represents apartment buildings of four stories or less, containing more than four dwelling units. Each apartment includes its own kitchen and bathroom, as well as bedroom(s) and living area.

## Lodging, continued

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### 1110 - Apartment, Low Rise, Older

**Description:** Older low rise apartments are based upon assumptions typical for dwellings built prior to 1950. These assumptions not only affect the materials that the building is based upon, but the room size, number of plumbing fixtures per unit, and the number of windows and doors are also affected. Low rise apartments typically have few or one common exterior entrance, a lobby area, and individual apartment entrances located along interior hallways. Compared to the newer apartment occupancies ([1100 - Apartment, Low Rise \(1 to 4 Stories\)](#) or [1200 - Apartment, High Rise \(Over 4 Stories\)](#)), older apartments typically have higher quality finishes but fewer building services. This occupancy represents older apartment buildings of four stories or less, containing more than four dwelling units. Each apartment includes its own kitchen and bathroom as well as bedroom(s) and living area.

This occupancy represents apartment buildings that are five or more stories in height. Each apartment includes its own kitchen and bathroom, as well as bedroom(s) and living area.

**Note:** To complete a valuation for the shell only of a high-rise apartment, use [1221 - Apartment, High Rise, Shell](#) instead of this occupancy. Likewise, to complete a valuation for the interior space only of a high-rise apartment, use [1222 - Apartment, High Rise, Interior Space](#).

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### 1225 - Luxury Apartment, High Rise

**Description:** Luxury high-rise apartments typically have one exterior entrance, a central lobby area, and individual apartment entrances that are located along interior hallways. This occupancy represents apartment buildings that are five or more stories in height. Similar [1200 - Apartment, High Rise \(Over 4 Stories\)](#), luxury apartments feature a higher level of finish in the living areas, lobby, and hallways. Often, the residence rooms are larger and have a higher ceiling height than ordinary apartments. The exterior finish is typically of an ornate quality. Each apartment includes its own kitchen and bathroom(s), as well as bedroom(s) and living area.

Each apartment includes its own kitchen, bathroom, living area, and bedroom(s). This occupancy represents apartment buildings that are generally two or less stories in height and have two to four dwelling units.

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### 1300 - Condominium

**Description:** Condominiums are similar to apartments (1100 - Apartment, Low Rise (1 to 4 Stories), 1200 - Apartment, High Rise (Over 4 Stories)) in their function and design. The condominium occupancy differs slightly from the apartment occupancies in that the condominium has higher quality finishes, and a higher plumbing density (more fixtures per unit). Each condominium unit contains its own kitchen, bathroom(s), bedrooms, and living space. Costs are intended for buildings with more than four dwelling units.

**Note:** To complete a valuation for the shell only of the condominium, use [1331 - Condominium, Shell](#) instead of this occupancy. Likewise, to complete a valuation for the interior space only of a condominium, use [1332 - Condominium, Interior Space](#).

## Lodging, continued

### 1335 - Condominium, without Interior Finishes

**Description:** This occupancy should be used when states or insurance policies require the condominium association to be responsible for many of the interior components that have been included in [1332 - Condominium, Interior Space](#).

For the electrical, all the wiring run within the walls is included, but fixtures are not. The same is true for plumbing. Hot and cold water pipes run within the walls or below the slab, along with sewer and ventilation stacks are included. However, no water heaters, sinks, showers, or toilets are included. All interior partition walls are framed, dry walled, and primed, but they lack any paint or other coverings offered within the program. The same is true for the floor and ceiling finishes. This occupancy does include heat, but air conditioning is not included. Also omitted from this occupancy are any cabinets or appliances.

**NOTE:** If interior finishes are included with the coverage, you can add them to the valuation using the appropriate interior finish adjustments within the program.

**Description:** Deluxe condominiums are similar to [1300 - Condominium](#) in their function and design. The deluxe condominium occupancy differs from the condominium occupancy in that the design is more complex and the finishes, inside and out, are high quality. Deluxe condominiums also have more window and door areas, and higher quality mechanical systems. Each condominium unit contains its own kitchen, bathroom(s), bedrooms, and living space. Costs are intended for buildings with more than four dwelling units.

**Note:** To complete a valuation for the shell only of the condominium, use [1331 - Condominium, Shell](#) instead of this occupancy. Likewise, to complete a valuation for the interior space only of a condominium, use [1332 - Condominium, Interior Space](#).

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### 1500 - Hotel, Full Service

**Description:** There are several occupancies offered for both Motel and Hotel. Although there are always exceptions, BVS distinguishes between the two in that generally hotels are found in a city and are more than 5 stories in height and motels are found along the highway or small towns and are less than 5 stories in height. This occupancy differs from [1550 - Hotel, Limited Service](#) in the size and number of common areas. The full service hotel generally has a large reception area, meeting rooms, and a large banquet or ball room. It also includes a restaurant and bar as part of the hotel and may even have a beauty or barber shop along with a small convenience store. The sleeping areas of both the full and limited service hotels are the same.

Construction type is selected based on the type of exterior wall and the type of structural floor (for the second floor). No adjustment should be made to the number of stories.

- Stairs
- Minimal Interior Partitions
- Provision for Entering and Exiting the Parking Area

**Not Included:**

- Slab
- Plumbing
- Heating and Cooling
- Ceiling, Wall, or Floor Finishes
- Costs for modifications made outside of the building (i.e.: ramps)

**Note:** No slab is included since it assumes the cost of the slab for the building that it is built on.
