
Scanning the Road for Safety 1. Observe not just the vehicle in front of you,



- but two or three vehicles in front of you. The farther ahead you look, the better.
- 2. Note how close together vehicles are and when vehicles are traveling faster or slower than you.
- 3. Prepare to reduce your speed if you see brake lights going on up ahead.
- 4. Look to both sides of your car. Be alert for situations that box you in.
- 5. Use your rear- and sideview mirrors, checking traffic to your rear about every five seconds.
- 6. Adjust your speed so that you are not sandwiched between cars in the lanes on either side of you.
- 7. Avoid driving in the blind spot of cars to either side of you. And check your own blind spot before changing lanes.
